Driving Directions

From Ballarat

Take the Midland Highway to Guildford. At Guildford turn right onto Kemps Bridge Road and then after 3.5 kilometres turn right on to Vaughan Springs Road. Travel 2.5 kilometres to Vaughan Springs, continue on and then after 2 kilometres turn right towards Glenluce. After 3 kilometres turn right at the orienteering sign onto Helbe Track. Follows o-signs a short way to the parking area. Park as directed by officials.

From Melbourne

Take the Calder Freeway to Malmsbury. In Malmsbury turn left towards Daylesford/Glenlyon and after about 3 kilometres turn right onto the Vaughan Springs Road. Follow this for 14 kilometres. Watch out for kangaroos along this road! Just after the Glenluce sign and shortly after the road returns to bitumen turn left at the orienteering sign onto Helbe Track. Follows o-signs a short way to the parking area. Park as directed by officials.

From Bendigo

Travel south to Chewton, east of Castlemaine. From Chewton take Fryers Road south through Fryerstown. Continue south along Vaughan-Chewton Road, after a few kilometres turning left to Glenluce. After 3 kilometres turn right at orienteering sign onto Helbe Track. Follows o-signs a short way to the parking area. Park as directed by officials.

Start Times

Start from 10.00 am to 12.30 pm (remember to set your clocks BACK an hour on Saturday night)

Enter on the day

Entry on the day is available for a limited number of people, with a \$5 surcharge.



Maps

1:10 000. Five metre contours. Mapped 2002. Mapper: Alex Tarr.

Maps will be printed on paper. So you may wish to collect an A3 (Courses 1 and 2) or an A4 (Courses 3 to 8) plastic bag before you go to the map trays.

Dangerous Mines

Some courses pass close to very deep sheer mine shafts. Take care! Some dangerous mine shafts will be marked with blue and yellow tapes.
