A warm welcome to all school participants and good luck for the three days of competition.



ASOC CHAMPIONSHIPS

ASOC is a three day carnival within the Australian Orienteering Championship carnival for students turning 12 and over in 2024 in accordance with <u>The Australian Schools Championships Rules of Competition 24 June 2024</u>

There are essentially three competitions run over the three days:

- Australian Schools Orienteering Championships (ASOC)
- Southern Cross Junior Challenge (SCJC)
- · Overall winners of the championship events

Australian School Teams (AST) State team members are eligible for:

- Individual sprint
- Individual long
- Relay
- Team individual event which now combines the first three fastest runners in both the sprint and long (note in case of a tie times will be considered)

Australian School Team members are also eligible for:

- SCJC medallions for the overall winners
- Australian Schools Honour team.
- Rob Simson Memorial Shield for best newcomer
- The ASSOA shield which will be presented to the best performing team.



NZ school teams (NZST) - Harua and Karahiwi – team members are eligible:


- to compete against the AST for the Southern Cross Junior Challenge (SCJC) trophy
- · to receive SCJC medallions if they place in the individual sprint and/or long
- to receive SCJC medallions if they place in the relay

Independent athletes - non-selected school aged athletes participates as an independent entries are eligible:

- to start in the first starting block of both the individual sprint and long events.
- may make up composite relay teams with members of the AST and NZST where all full relay teams have been exhausted
- to receive ASOC & SCJC medallions if they place in the individual sprint and/or long events
- to receive SCJC medallions if they place in the relay

- To respect and abide by the rules that govern these Championships in the best traditions of school sport; and above all else, to enjoy!"

ATHLETE CODE OF CONDUCT

In addition to Orienteering Australia's general code of conduct, you must meet the following requirements regarding your conduct during any activity held or sanctioned by Orienteering Australia, a member association or an affiliated club and in your role as a player/participant in any activity held by or under the auspices of Orienteering Australia, a member association or an affiliated club:

- Respect the rights, dignity and worth of fellow players, coaches, officials and spectators.
- · Do not tolerate acts of aggression.
- Respect the talent, potential and development of fellow players and competitors.
- Care for and respect the equipment provided to you as part of your program.
- Be frank and honest with your coach concerning illness and injury and your ability to train fully within the program requirements.
- · At all times avoid intimate relationships with your coach.
- Conduct yourself in a professional manner relating to language, temper and punctuality.
- Maintain high personal behaviour standards at all times.
- Abide by the rules and respect the decision of the official, making all appeals through the formal process and respecting the final decision.
- Be honest in your attitude and preparation to training. Work equally hard for yourself and your team.
- Cooperate with coaches and staff in development of programs to adequately prepare you for competition at the highest level.

COMPETITION RULES

- **1.** The Competition Rules for IOF Foot Orienteering Events 1-Jan-2024 apply to the World Ranking Events for WRE courses (Events 1, 6, and 7).
- 2. The Competition Rules for Orienteering Australia Foot Orienteering Events 1-Jan-2024 apply to the Australian Orienteering Championships Group A events (events 1, 2, 6, and 7, and the Thunderbolts 3 Day Group B events 3b, 4b, and 5b).
- **The Australian Schools Championships Rules of Competition 24 June 2024** apply to the Schools Championship events (3a, 4a, and 5a) in addition to the OA Group B event rules.

SCHOOLS COMPETITION NUMBERS

Each competitor in the schools individual championships will be issued with a number prior to the start of the championships. This number will indicate the class, state and individual number. It is to be worn only for the ASOC Individual sprint and ASOC long distance events.



ASOC RELAY

Team managers will be issued with relay numbers at the managers meeting just prior to the race.

SIAC will be used for all of the ASOC events, and all of the AOC events. See the overall competition bulletin 2 for details of punching mode for each event.



MAPPERS NOTES

Terrain is a school campus with buildings, canopies, garden beds, a lake and small stream, trees, playing fields and paved areas.

Only the main running level is mapped. Once stairs leave the main running level they are not mapped or shown as canopy to emphasise that they can be run underneath.

The light pink temporary out of bounds symbol is used to show out of bounds areas such as bins, sports equipment or vehicles.





COURSE PLANNER NOTES

Terrain is an 1890s school campus surrounded by sports fields, a lake and gardens. While some areas of the campus do extend to multiple levels only the ground level is mapped. Stairs that extend to other levels of the school have not been mapped. The light pink temporary out of bounds symbol (714) is used to show out of bounds areas such as bins, sports equipment or vehicles.

There is a small creek that runs through a part of the map, it is approx 1.5 m wide with rocks at the bottom it is mapped with symbol 301, thus is impassable. However, there are two small bridges across the creek which are mapped using symbols 501 *Paved area* and 710.1 *Crossing Point*.








TUESDAY 1ST OCTOBER

There is an arena passage and map flip on courses 1, 2, 3, 4, 5, and 6. After the runners have punched the last/spectator control they will follow the mandatory route before splitting into either the finish chute or towards the restart (see the arena map). The start of the second map will be marked with a start triangle.

TUESDAY 1ST OCTOBER



START

There is one start for both the schools sprint and the Thunderbolts 3 Day- Day 1. The pre start location is marked on the arena layout.

Start Interval The start interval for the Thunderbolts 3 Day will be 30 sec.



QUARANTINE

All competitors in the Australian Schools Sprint must have signed into Quarantine by 9:00am. Team officials may accompany their athletes to quarantine, however once they exit they cannot re-enter. There will be access to toilets, shade and a warmup area while in quarantine. While in quarantine mobile phones must be powered off and in athletes' bags. There is a bag drop from which athletes can collect their bags after their race.

There is a compulsory route to Quarantine for all schools competitors.

Leaving NEGS turn left onto Uralla Road for 2km then turn left at the roundabout over the railway bridge. Then immediately right onto Kentucky street for 650m before a left onto Taylor Street. After 500m turn right onto Mann Street and park along this street. Do not park in Mann St east of access gate.

It is not allowed to visit the arena before entering quarantine.



GPS TRACKING

The selected runners who are required to carry GPS trackers can pick up their tracker from a table on the verandah in the building at the eastern end of quarantine. The names of the athletes will be given to team management at the start draw.



TOILETS

Toilets for the schools competitors are located under the McConville building. These can be accessed from quarantine. Thunderbolts 3 Day competitors are to use the toilets T1- see arena layout- until 10:30. After 10:30 both sets of toilets can be used.



PARKING

There is no vehicle access to the school. All parking will be in Mann St to the west of the access gate to the arena.

COURSE PLANNER'S NOTES

Terrain

The map covers a range of terrain, from farmland paddocks and open eucalypt forest with outcrops of rock, to steep hilly areas with dense and complex rock detail. There are numerous areas of patchy slow-run and walk vegetation comprising mainly tea-tree, wattle, blackthorn and dead-fin-ish/cough bush (cassinia laevis), as well as occasional patches of blackberry. Full leg cover is therefore recommended. Overall, the area is moderately hilly with some steeper sections and rock detail.

Courses

All ASOC courses have a long-distance character. Courses 1 (Senior Boys) and 2 (Senior Girls) pass a spectator control towards the end of the course. All the courses have fence crossings, these are highly recommended but not mandatory especially as there are some sections of fence which are very difficult to cross. They will be marked in the terrain with red and white streamers.



ARENA LAYOUT





START

There is one start location for both the schools' competitors and the Thunderbolt 3 Days competitors.

Schools: The pre-start is a 400m flat walk from the quarantine. Schools' competitors are reminded that they should not talk to any members of the public during their walk to the start, any competitor doing so may be disqualified.

Thunderbolts 3 Days: It is a flat 500 m walk from the Arena – follow the ORANGE taped route.



QUARANTINE

Quarantine is where the school tents are located on the arena layout.

There is a compulsory quarantine which all schools' competitors (both independent and official) must go directly to on arrival (do not go to the assembly first). Quarantine will be at the school tents as indicated on the arena layout. Competitors will be released from quarantine 10 minutes before their call up time.





WEDNESDAY 2ND OCTOBER

State teams' managers are responsible for taking bags to the arena so competitors can access them after they have run.

Competitors can warm up on the track SW of the quarantine.

COURSE PLANNER'S NOTES Terrain

The courses go through a variety of terrains, from fast running farmland, forest with occasional rock outcrops, steep hilly areas with dense and to complex rock detail. There are numerous areas of patchy slow-run and walk vegetation, and some occasional patches of blackberry. Following a fire on the southern part of the map early in 2020 (just after the Xmas 5 days), large patches of wattle have sprung up. Although these patches are for the most part mapped as walk, they are not impossibly difficult to get through.

There are fences in the area that are hard to cross. Gates on the map are all open and will be used in all courses. The longer courses also have marked fence crossings, they are highly recommended but not mandatory to use. They will be marked in the terrain with red and white streamers.

Courses

The Start triangle for the relay is approximately 100 metres south-east of the assembly area. First leg runners will receive their maps just prior to their start. Maps for second and third leg runners will be on a "clothesline" near the changeover/start, then follow the taped route to the start triangle.

The relay courses feature multiple splits and, as a result, there will be lots of controls in the area – please make sure you check control numbers on your course! There is a spectator control that all relay courses visit, approximately one third of the way through their course.





REGISTRATION

Accommodation will be provided for all reps, coaches, managers & some volunteers at New England Girls School (NEGS) Armidale. Registration will start at 4pm Friday 27 September in the common room of ground floor Kirkwood House. If any of your team arrive later than the managers, advise them to go straight to the boarding house where they will be staying.

The AOC 2024 registration will be in the MPC, 5pm - 8pm. Parents can go to registration then drop their rep off at Kirkwood House.

Dinner will start at 6pm. If any reps will be arriving after 7pm, then you must let **Lynda** know which rep as soon as possible.

ACCOMMODATION

Everyone over the age of 18, except State reps, will be given an identifying lanyard & tag to show they are part of ASOC. Please always wear it at NEGS so school management & reps know you are part of ASOC 2024.

We will be housed in 3 of the boarding houses with each team housed together in the following arrangement:

Dickens House Ground Floor: NZ, Harua & Karahiwi

Dickens House 1st Floor: ACT & NSW

Kirkwood House Ground Floor: Qld

Kirkwood House 1st Floor: Vic & WA

Suamarez House 1st Floor: SA Suamarez House 2nd Floor: Tas

The boarding houses have a mixture of 1 bed rooms up to a 5 bed dormitory. You will be given a floor plan with suggested arrangements in your welcome packs.

Most managers & coaches will stay in, or close to, a bedroom with an ensuite bathroom. We strongly encourage managers & coaches who stay in the rooms with an ensuite to share that with other adults in their team. There is a shower block & toilet block on each floor. Each will be designated as either male or female. Some reps, coaches & managers will have to go to another floor to use the bathrooms.

Each boarding house has a common room with a fridge, microwave oven & storage shelves. Some have TV's & lounge areas. There are no facilities for cooking. Some teams will share their common room. Teams will need to label food & important items. Indelible pens will be supplied. Remind teams indelible ink does NOT wash off.

Teams are to bring linen including towels, sheets, doonas & pillows. Alternatively bring a sleeping bag, inner sheet, towel & camping pillow. Do not bring or use any kind of sprays in the boarding houses. The fire alarm call out fee is now \$1760.



Each boarding house has a laundry with washing machine & dryer. Some have clothes lines. Washing powder, stain remover & clothes pegs will be supplied. You will be able to access some of the laundries 24/7.

PARKING

All buses will be able to park near or adjacent to their boarding house. See the attached map.

DINING ROOM

The dining room is a short walk from the boarding houses. Breakfast is at 6.30 am every day for an hour (except on Monday 30th September and Friday 4th October when they will start at 8am). Early start runners should eat first as the dining room cannot house 200 people at the same time. Late starts should wait until about 7am. Breakfast will be a mixture of cold foods eg cereal on a side-board, and hot food served from warm Bain Marie's.

Lunch will be prepared & packed in the kitchen each day. It will be a roll or wrap, muesli bar, fruit & a juice popper. Lunch will be taken to the events each morning by volunteers. On rest days lunch will be collected by managers about an hour after breakfast has finished.

Dinner will be in the dining room every evening 6pm to 7pm. It will be salads or vegetables with several warm dishes served from a Bain Marie.

On Thursday evening 3rd October the ASOC 2024 Presentation Dinner will be upstairs at 5.30pm at The Ex-Services Club, Dumaresq Street, Armidale. It will be a 2 course dinner with fruit juice & a self serve juice machine. It is alcohol free. Parents are welcome to attend the presentation. We suggest they eat prior to arriving. Teams will have access to the Presentation Room from 3:00pm onwards to decorate it. Bring something that you can decorate your tables with in your State colours.

At every meal remind the reps to check & ask what is in the food, especially if they have a food intolerance or allergy. It is not the kitchen staff's responsibility to make sure you or the reps are served the correct food.

Everyone with a food allergy or intolerance will be given a tag on a lanyard so the staff can identify them & make sure that person's meal is not given to another person. This lanyard needs to be worn to every meal at NEGS and to the Presentation Dinner.

TEAM MEETINGS

There are 5 rooms available for team meetings marked 4,5,6,7,8 on the map. They will have computer access, WiFi available & projector screens for team meetings. If there is an informal team meeting these can be held in the larger common rooms, subject to adjacent teams agreeing. Any large meetings will be held in the MPC (marked as NEGS Sporting Complex on the map).

MPC - MULTI PURPOSE CENTRE


We have access to it for games, the Trivia Night, the Games night & the Disco. The Pre & Post ASOC meetings, and the Honour Team meeting will be held there.
