



Cyclones Information Session

Are you a 16yo or older who wants to know what the Queensland Cyclones is about?



Are you interested in attending interstate National Orienteering League (NOL) competitions and continuing to participate in orienteering beyond schools? Do you run 17-20s or 21s and want to take your orienteering interstate?

With the Australian Orienteering Championships in Brisbane in 2025, this is the perfect time to find out how **you** as a 17-20 or 21 athlete (not just elite class) can represent your state, meet orienteers from around Australia, and enjoy a social + orienteering atmosphere (like ASOC) well into your twilight years.

The Queensland Cyclones is Queensland's team of orienteers who represent the state in National Orienteering League competitions (including Easter and AOC). We travel together to interstate events with financial support from OQ, compete as a team, and organise various fundraising orienteering events in Queensland.

The Queensland Cyclones will be running an information session at the Gray's house after the Centenary SHS Cyclones sprint. We can cool off after the sprint in the pool, play some games, eat some food, then find out about Cyclones: competition, participation, social, uniforms, and everything else you want to know.



This information + games session is aimed at three groups:

- Existing Cyclones wanting to recruit and show off their uniforms.
- Prospective Cyclones (soon to be joining 17-20s, already in 17-20s, or in 21s who want to know more).
- Parents of Prospective Cyclones.

All these people are invited, **women and girls are especially encouraged to attend**. Queensland has a long history of participation and success in the women’s categories, with notable standouts including Anna Sheldon being the only woman to have hit 400 National Orienteering League races, and our Junior Women taking out the NOL title in 2022, which requires talent **and depth**.
