FINAL INSTRUCTIONS-HARLIN OY6

Directions & Assembly area

Make your way to Harlin (north of Esk). Just north of the village of Harlin, turn west into Turtle Creek Rd. There will be O signs from here. Follow Turtle creek Road for approx. 5.6 kms, turn left into Grieves Rd (just past Glenhowden Rd) and follow to the end of the road (7.8km). Go through this gate, shutting it after you. Continue straight ahead, through another gate to the left of the house, closing it behind you. Continue ahead through two deer gates. One will need to be opened and closed. One will be open. The assembly area is about 500m past the second deer gate. Proceed through to the parking area.

What to bring

There will be plenty of water on the courses, but you are welcome to bring your own as well. There will be a pivot control (Hard 1 is 3 loops, Hard 2 is two loops, Hard 3 and Moderate are 1 loop) where Hard 1 and Hard 2 runners can leave your own energy gels, etc. There will be fruit cake, fruit, chocolates and water supplied here.

Catering

Range Runners orienteering Club will have a food stall at the assembly area where you can purchase sausage on bread, soup, tea, coffee and soft drinks.

Toilets

There will be a bush toilet.

The Map

The map for the hard and moderate courses will be 1:30,000 scale with 10 metre contours. There are no fences marked, and only the main track. Gullies and watercourses are marked, but some 'blue lines' (watercourses) are just gullies.

The easy and very easy courses will be 1:10000 scale with 10 metre contours and all fences and tracks marked.

All maps will be bagged.

Start times

Starts will be from 9.00am. The course will close at 2.00pm

The Area

The area is very fast and open with some very steep slopes. There is a small amount of lantana in some creeks.

Mobile reception

There is limited coverage on the ridges

Landowners and property

Andrew and Sheree Grieves have granted permission to use this land. Please respect their property and remember:

- Leave all gates as you find them. **IF YOU OPEN A GATE YOU MUST CLOSE IT.**
- Be careful at fence crossings – always go under to avoid fence damage. Do not enter any land shown as out-of-bounds. These areas are bounded by deer fences.
- Cattle are not used to seeing people on foot. Give them a wide berth.
- All rubbish must be returned to the assembly area.
