5. About This Event:

This is the second event in the Southern Winter Saturday Afternoon Series. It uses recently remapped areas of the Ridgeway map as well as parts of the Waterworks map but with assembly outside the Waterworks to overcome any early closing of the Waterworks gates. Be prepared for tight navigation in and out of old quarries and along bike tracks on a steep hillside.

6. Where Is The Start Area?

Drive up Waterworks road just past the entrance to the waterworks. Parking is in the clear area on the right hand side of Waterworks Road.

Starts from 3.00 pm till 4.00 pm, Course closure at 5.00 pm
