- 5. **About This Event:** This is the last of five events that make up the Northern Saturday Afternoon Series for 2017. Come and enjoy the tracks, trails and the bush within Trevallyn NRA. Walk or run with your mates, friends or family. There will be courses to suit all ages and fitness levels.
- 6. **Where Is The Start Area?** The start area will be at "The Grid". From Launceston head into the Trevallyn Reserve along Reatta Road, turn left onto Duck Reach Rd and park immediately.
- 7. When Are Start Times? Start anytime between 1pm and 2:30pm
- 8. **What Are The Courses?** Four courses are available to suit your age, fitness and experience. Beginning and occasional orienteers are welcome.

Short - Course 3 (1.6km, Easy) is suitable for beginners and families with young children. Medium - Course 2 and Walkers (2.7km, Moderate) is suitable for those who have orienteered before and families with older children with moderate navigation.

Course 1 (4.9 kms, Moderate to hard navigation) suits more experienced orienteers and those who like going 'off road'.

All courses cross the road - please take care.

- 9. **Do I need an e-stick or P card?** All Tasmanian Orienteering clubs use the SportIdent (SI) electronic punching system so an e-stick or a P card is required at all events. If you do not own an e-stick or P card, you can hire one for \$4 at the event. These are also available for purchase at most events.
- 10. **How Much Does It Cost To Enter?** Casual Adults \$12, Youth or Concession \$6, Family \$30. Discounts for full members.
- 11. How Do I Enter? Turn up! Enter on the day at the assembly area.
