5. About This Event:

This is the fourth of five events that make up the Southern Saturday Series.

Continue your sunbaking from the previous event at Waverley Park by coming over to the sunny Eastern Shore. Rosny Hill juts out from the Bellerive Quay giving magnificent views along the shoreline to the Tasman Bridge with regular glimpses of the Mona Ferry. A brand new play area and amenities structure has been opened at Kangaroo Bay at the extreme east of the map as well as a redeveloped oval and new home of the Clarence District Cricket Club and skatepark.

The start is at Rosny College allowing plenty of room for car parking. Courses will wind around Rosny Hill allowing for great views and some bush exploration.

Normal courses and cryptic courses offered.



6. Where Is The Start Area?

The start is just off the main Rosny College car park.

From Hobart, come over the Tasman Bridge, take exit to Bellerive, keep in right hand lane and about half way down the hill (about 200 metres) take the right hand exit (with lights) to go up Riaweena Road. Follow this up towards Rosny Hill lookout, take the first left into Bastick Street, follow along until the entrance to Rosny College and the Rosny Bowls Club on the left with the start in the main car park. Toilets can be accessed in the new amenities structure at Kangaroo Bay and in the bottom of the Clarence District Cricket Club building.

7. When Are Start Times?

Start any time between 1:30 and 3:00 pm. Course closure is 4:00pm.

8. What Are The Courses?

Some slightly longer than normal courses with the first JEMDOG for 2017!

Super offer!! Cryptic Long and Medium courses. Can you do cryptic crosswords? Do you fancy yourself as a Miss Marple or Hercule Peroit? Are you good at solving puzzles? Do you like a challenge? Can you understand the course setter's subtle clues, find the controls and complete the course? The cryptic maps have control circles somewhere near the controls with clues that once solved should guide you to the feature. Gaiters should not be required.

Note: all courses except the short may have decoy controls and controls close together adding to the need for good observation and checking control numbers.
