

ET2018 Entry Terms and Conditions

The following Entry Terms and Conditions (“the T&Cs”) apply to all competitors who enter any event that forms part of Easter Tasmania 2018 an orienteering carnival which includes the Domain Warm Up Event, the Prologue, the Australian 3 Days and the Bay of Fires 3 Days which is being conducted over the period 29 March to 7 April 2018 (“ET2018”) and is being organised by Orienteering Tasmania Inc (“OT”) and which competitors are asked to accept on entering when they tick the box *“I have read and accepted the terms and conditions.”*

1. The T&Cs, the Rules and the Website

The T&Cs are in addition to and to be read in conjunction with:

- a) The Competition Rules for Orienteering Australia Foot Orienteering Events (“the Rules”) which OT must comply with in organising ET2018 and which competitors must comply with in participating and are available at http://orienteering.asn.au/wp-content/uploads/2016/03/OAFootCompetitionRules_2016.pdf and as may be amended by Orienteering Australia from time to time; and
- b) any terms and conditions set out in the ET2018 website www.eastertasmania2018.net.au (“the Website”) either specifically or by inference and as amended from time to time.

OT strongly advises all competitors read the Rules and the Website prior to entering and on an ongoing basis for any amendments and updates. If there is any conflict or confusion, the Rules prevail over the Website.

2. General Risk Warning

Competing in an orienteering event is subject to risks. These include death, serious injury or illness due to:

- a) rough terrain and obstacles;
- b) over exertion;
- c) heat, cold or other adverse weather conditions;
- d) plant and animal life; and
- e) accidents with vehicles, other competitors or pedestrians.

There are also risks:

- a) that access to medical, evacuation or search services might be slow; and

b) of damage to, or loss of, your personal property.

3. Risk Waiver

Competitors:

- a) are aware that orienteering is a recreational activity that can be dangerous, accept that there is a degree of risk and acknowledge that participation in ET2018 is at their own risk;
- b) are aware of, and will comply with the Rules and any directions of OT through its officials and volunteers; and
- c) release OT, its affiliated clubs, members and all other parties associated with organising ET2018 from any responsibility or legal liability associated with their presence at, and participation in, ET2018.

4. Photography

Photos might be taken during ET2018 that might be used to complement stories on the Website and other websites, the ET2018 or Orienteering Australia Facebook Pages, the ET2018 instagram account and/or published in newspapers, magazines or The Australian Orienteer. If competitors or parents and guardians of children who are competitors object to the publication of a photograph please advise OT through an email to traveltips@eastertasmania2018.net.au

5. Competitor Acknowledgements

- a) Competitors are aware there is no health, accident, ambulance, disability or life insurance provided by OT.
- b) Competitors allow the free use of their names and photos in entry information, results, news, marketing and promotional material pertaining to ET2018 or orienteering. This does not extend to publishing a photo of a person under 18 with their name.

6. Acknowledgements of Parents and Guardians of Children who are Competitors

Parents and guardians of children entered as competitors in ET2018 acknowledge:

- a) they are at all times responsible for the supervision and duty of care of their children;
- b) they are at all times responsible for deciding whether their children are capable of orienteering by themselves;
- c) they are at all times responsible for ensuring their children understand and comply with the Rules and follow the directions of OT through officials and other volunteers;

- d) children going orienteering without an adult need to be able to make decisions about their own safety;
- e) that even though orienteering courses for children will be set with a consideration of safety OT cannot possibly eliminate risks inherent in the sport or take any responsibility for any decisions made by children;
- f) that while OT may exercise the discretion under rule 6.2 of the Rules to refuse participation this discretion cannot be relied on by parents and guardians to determine whether their children are capable of orienteering by themselves; and
- g) there are the options of the W/M 10 Shadow class and the ability to Enter on the Day with an adult - both as set out in the Website - and these are the alternatives that OT strongly advises be taken if there are any concerns at all about children orienteering by themselves.

7. Interpretation

Unless the context otherwise requires, words in the singular shall include the plural and in the plural include the singular.
