The Queensland Schools Orienteering Championships are approaching fast!

A **sprint**, a **long distance** course and a **relay**, in Brisbane's South-East.

Open to all school students who can complete a course independently.

Championship age classes:

11 years and under

13 years and under

15 years and under

19 years and under (Age as at 31 December 2018)

Relay: All students who enter will be placed in a team.

Public races: There will be courses for parents and friends as well, with a choice of easy, moderate and hard courses.

Which class should I enter?

Up to 13 years: if you have already participated in an orienteering event, you can simply enter your age class. **Older students** have the choice between a Standard class and a Championship class for bush events. Only students who are **experienced at orienteering independently in the bush** should enter the Championship class.

How to enter

Entry is online using [Eventor](#).

- There will be no entry or payment on the day.
- In addition, **please fill in the [School Information Form](#)**.

If you are new to Eventor, please read the guide: “[How to enter through Eventor](#)”.

Darling Downs students: You should enter using **Eventor** (and fill in the [School Information Form](#)), but your team manager will organise your payment.

Eventor Tip: to make a single payment for all events:

- first register in Eventor
- tick all 3 events on the [Eventor Calendar page](#), then click “enter selected events”

If you are members of an orienteering club:

- before proceeding to payment, click “enter, cancel or change entry for another member” to enter other family members.
