All courses are of 'easy navigation' difficulty: Courses are set along handrails such as tracks and fences. Controls are located either on or adjacent to handrail features. Grade 5 and 6 students are provided with route choice challenges: "will I take the short track that goes over the hill, or the track that goes the long way around the hill?" "Pairs" age classes are provided to encourage and support less confident students.

Each student may only enter ONE category

PAYMENT POLICY

- ALL payments for the Championships are to be made to Orienteering Victoria preferably by direct-debit.
- If paying by cheque: Please make your cheques payable to 'Victorian Orienteering Association'

FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

"My teaching schedule is tight - will I be required to do much preparation for the day"?

All orienteering requirements will be prepared by Orienteering Victoria. This includes allocation of start-times, preparation of competition maps, control descriptions and results. Your responsibility is to enter your students and then get them safely to and from the event! Familiarisation with the map and basic orienteering procedures will assist your students in approaching the day confidently.

"What are the basic map reading skills required"?

Students should know how to orientate their map to north. Know that the triangle shows them the START and the double circle the FINISH. The controls are found in the centre of the circle drawn on their map. Controls must be visited in order.

"What happens on the day?"

Each student is allocated a start-time. At their appointed start-time, students use their pre-marked map to navigate to all the control points in sequential order until they reach the Finish. Based on previous Championships, teachers can expect most students to complete their courses in 45-75 minutes. Results for each student is calculated and then displayed.

"Will there be presentations?"

The Award Presentation will be held at approximately 1.30pm.

1st, 2nd and 3rd place-getters in each age category will be presented with an award.

There is an award "Best School" (overall), as determined by points which are allocated to the top ten place-getters in each age category.

"Can I take photos of my students?"

You are welcome to take photos of <u>your own</u> students on the day (assuming you have received permission from parents and guardians). Orienteering Victoria may take photos or video of competitors to be published on the OV web page and in the media to celebrate their achievements.

OV will publish the names of individual place-getters with their school names on the OV web site.

If you wish to have a student's name and/or images withheld you can inform OV via the column provided on the entry form (excel spreadsheet). This is an opt-out process as is consistent with School Sport Victoria policy.



EXCITING CHANGES COMING IN 2019

In 2019 Orienteering Victoria will be expanding its school's championships fixture into a more traditional school-sport model.

Students will compete in a zone championship where the top competitors will be invited to compete at the state championships. Competitors who continue to excel will then be selected to compete for Victoria at the Australian Schools Orienteering Championships. In addition, age categories will be reduced to reflect our traditional competition classes (and be consistent with other school-sports). Ideally this model will see students initially competing against local and familiar schools within their area, with staff and parents being able to engage directly with local clubs and coaches for support.

Pairs categories will only be available at the zone level and will not proceed to state championships.
