About This Event:

In addition to the Tasmanian All Schools Orienteering Championships this is the first of seven events that make up the Northern Local Series.

Where is the Start?

To get to the assembly area:

From Evandale go SE on the C416 (Nile Road) towards Nile for ~8km. Turn left (NE) onto the C419 (Bryants Lane) towards Deddington (opposite the turn-off to Clarendon House). Follow this road for ~4km and watch for orienteering signs onto the Glen Stuart property. GPS coordinates of entry gate [-41.612288, 147.350684](#)

From the south, turn N onto the C416 off the Midlands Highway 1.5 km past the Conara railway crossing. Follow the signs to Clarendon House/Nile for ~33km (a major section of which is dirt road), then turn right (NE) onto Bryants Lane. Alternatively, travel further along the Midlands Highway past Symmons Plains and turn right (NE) onto the B41 towards Evandale.

The start is located approximately 500 m along a farm track from the finish.

When Can I Start?

School students will start between 10:00 and 11:00. School entries will be allocated start times. For non-Schools competitors, starts will be after the school competitors. Pre-entry is not required and start times will not be allocated. Just turn up at the Start after the last Schools competitor (probably about 11:00am).

Course closure will be 1:30pm.

When Do I Have To Finish?

You need to finish before the course is closed at 1:30pm. If you will not be able to complete your course in time you will need to abandon it and head back to the assembly area to arrive by course closure time. Whether or not you have completed your course, you must download your SI at the computer, so that we know you have returned safely, and don't organise a search party for you. Also be aware that as soon as the course is closed, the organisers start bringing in controls.

Do I need an e-stick or P card?

All Tasmanian Orienteering clubs use the SportIdent (SI) electronic punching system so an e-stick or a P card is required at all events. If you do not own an e-stick or P card, you can hire one for \$4 at the event. These are also available for purchase at most events. Please note that P-cards are not suitable for courses with more than 19 controls, so talk to the registration team if you have this problem.

How Do I Enter?

School entries should be emailed through via the schools entry form. Non-schools entries can enter on the day. Pre-entry by 12 midnight April 4th. Adults can just turn up on the day.
