

Accommodation Dryandra Lions Village - 2019 Easter Carnival



The South West Orienteering Trekkers (SWOT) orienteering club is running the Wandoo Wander score event in the Dryandra Woodland on the afternoon of the 25 April as part of the Easter Carnival.

Accommodation is available at the Lions Dryandra Woodland Village (<http://dryandravillage.org.au/>) from Wednesday (24 April) to Friday night (26 April) inclusive. The Currawong Complex provides Bunk style beds in 4 dormitories.

The village is only 31.5kms from Narrogin....perfect for the last three events of the Easter Carnival!!

- Cost:** \$50 covers the three nights (stay 1, 2 or 3 nights for the fixed price)
- Dates:** 24th, 25th and 26th April 2019. (If arriving 24th April – check in 2.30pm and if departing on 26 April check out is 10am)
- Beds:** Bunk style, mattress provided on each bunk
- BYO:** Bedding (e.g. sheet, sleeping bag/blankets/duona and pillow), torch and all food and drink (water available)
- Booking:** via Eventor – closes at midnight on Tuesday 24th April

Note: The weather is quite changeable in April and can be cold overnight - warm clothing/bedding is suggested. Toilet/shower complex is separate building to the dormitories (need footwear between buildings)

Conditions of stay - In booking accommodation, you agree to abide by the items below:

General: no pets or drones allowed; 20km/hr in the village; collection of firewood from the Woodland is prohibited; do not feed the animals/birds.

Dorms:

- Each person is responsible for keeping their area clean and the aisles clear (toilets are in a separate building – don't want people tripping over belongings in the night!)
- Be respectful to fellow dorm-mates
- Take conversations (includes phones) and activity to the common area
- No eating in the dorms
- Keep the lights off in the dorms overnight - use a flashlight when entering/leaving the dorm – unless an emergency situation

Kitchen and common area:

- Leave common spaces clean and tidy
- Use the pots/dishes etc. as you need and clean them directly. Leave everything tidy
- Before putting your food in the fridge or shelves tag your food with your name (sticky notes available)
- Common areas are meant to be for eating, hanging out, meeting people, or having telephone conversations (though there is limited phone reception)

Shower/toilet complex

- Be water wise (no mains water – relies on rainwater) and keep shower time to a minimum
- Leave your area tidy after you finish

Additional Information

Local attraction *(A must see!)*

Barna Mia Nocturnal Wildlife Experience (<https://parks.dpaw.wa.gov.au/site/barna-mia-nocturnal-wildlife-experience>). About 15 minutes from the Dryandra Lions Village.

Take a guided nocturnal tour in a tranquil sanctuary that has become home for some of Western Australia's native animals facing extinction. A tour guide takes visitors on a delightful journey through the sanctuary. Using specially placed lights, you can see threatened native animals such as dalgyte, woylie, wurrup, quenda and boodie.

Tours operate several times per week beginning after sunset. Actual start times vary seasonally. March to November: Monday, Wednesday, Friday and Saturday (except on public holidays). Cost: \$22 adult, \$16 [concession](#), \$11 child, \$55 family (2 adults + 2 children under 16 years).
