About This Event:

This the fifth event in the statewide "OST" series with the usual 9 courses available. It is also the second selection event for the Tasmanian Schools team. It will be very exciting!

The area comprises private property and is characterised by broad plateau terrain with mixed farmland and forest dissected by deep valleys with extensive sandstone features including rock faces and boulders. For the shorter courses (8 and 9), it is largely open eucalypt forest and farm paddocks on mainly flat to undulating sandstone. Remapped by Alex Tarr in 2017.

Where is the Start?

From Hobart Take the Midlands Hwy 67km north to the Lovely Banks Road (C316) turnoff (approximately 12km past Kempton). Turn right onto Lovely Banks Road and travel about 4km (unsealed). Turn right into the paddock. Travel time about 1 hour.

From Launceston Take the Midlands Hwy 140km south to the Lovely Banks Road (C316) turnoff (approximately 25km south of Oatlands). Turn left onto Lovely Banks Road and travel about 4km (unsealed). Turn right into the paddock. Travel time about 1hr 45min

Gate is at -42.461657 147.266710 (S42 27.699 E147 16.003) and will be signposted. Parking is just inside the gate

All courses have an easy 300-400m walk to the start. Allow sufficient time to get to the start (maybe 10 minutes).

When Can I Start?

You can start anytime between 10am and noon. Starting as early as possible gives you more time to

complete the course. Start times are likely to be pre-allocated for school students (courses 3, 4 and 7). We will do our best to be flexible to allow split start times if you have small people to care for.

When Do I Have To Finish?

You need to finish before the course is closed at 2:00pm. If you will not be able to complete your course in time you will need to abandon it and head back to the assembly area to arrive by course closure time. Whether or not you have completed your course, you must download your SI at the computer, so that we know you have returned safely, and don't organise a search party for you. Also be aware that as soon as the course is closed, the organisers start bringing in controls.

Do I need an e-stick or P card?

All Tasmanian Orienteering clubs use the SportIdent (SI) electronic punching system so an e-stick or

a P card is required at all events. If you do not own an e-stick or P card, you can hire one for \$4 at the event. These are also available for purchase at most events.

How Do I Enter?

Pre-entry via Eventor – Entries close at 11:59pm on Tuesday 7th of May, 2018. There will be a small selection of courses (at least Courses, 7 and 8) available for "enter on the day". Newcomers may enter course 7 or 8 on the day of the event.

Which Map Is Being Used?

Lovelybanks East (formerly Sandstone Valleys). Remapped and extended by Alex Tarr in 2017. All courses use a 5m contour interval.

Course 1 and 2 will use scale 1:15,000.

Courses 3 to 9 will use scale 1:10,000.

Information for Newcomers

Newcomers are encouraged to come along and give bush orienteering a try. Wear comfortable clothing and foot wear suitable for walking or running; bring warm clothes and wet weather gear in case the weather is inclement. Long pants are a good idea if you plan on doing a course that takes you off tracks and through the bush. When you arrive at the event come to the registration desk and let the organisers know you are new; an experienced member will help you through the registration, start and event procedure.

For OST events newcomers may enter on the day at the event, to do either course 7 (moderate navigation) or course 8 (easy navigation). If you enter via Eventor enter class M/W Open B for course 7 (moderate navigation) or class M/W Open C for course 8 (easy navigation).
