About This Event:

The first Saturday Series event of the season heads to the Queens Domain, home of Government House, the Botanical Gardens and a number of sporting facilities. It also has an extensive parkland and natural bush terrain set on a large hillside with a complex track network, suitable for good orienteering right in the middle of the city. The views of Hobart and the Derwent are outstanding.

Where is the Start?

The assembly area is at the newly developed Community Hub on Upper Domain Road between the Athletics Centre and sportsgrounds. Park in the carpark next to the Community Hub. This event is not using the trailer. The registration area will be at one of the BBQ shelters in the Community Hub.

When Can I Start?

You can start anytime between 1.30pm and 3.00pm. Starting as early as possible gives you more time to complete the course.

When Do I Have To Finish?

You need to finish before the course is closed at 4.00pm. If you will not be able to complete your course in time you will need to abandon it and head back to the assembly area to arrive by course closure time. Whether or not you have completed your course, you must download your SI at the computer, so that we know you have returned safely, and don't organise a search party for you. Also be aware that as soon as the course is closed, the organisers start bringing in controls.

What Are The Courses?

Novice -1.6 km with easy navigation Short -2.3 km with easy/moderate navigation Medium -3.2 km with moderate/hard navigation Long -4.2 km with moderate/hard navigation

Do I need an e-stick or P card?

All Tasmanian Orienteering clubs use the SportIdent (SI) electronic punching system so an e-stick or a P card is required at all events. If you do not own an e-stick or P card, you can hire one for \$4 at the event. These are also available for purchase at most events. Please note that P-cards are not

suitable for courses with more than 19 controls, so talk to the registration team if you have this problem.

Enter on the Day at the event assembly area.
