Carnival Format

Elites

Four day multi-stage competition. Cumulative time from all four stages to count.

Stage 1 – Sprint (World Ranking Event)

Stage 2 – Middle

Stage 3 – Long (World Ranking Event)

Stage 4 – Long

All other age classes

Family relay / Public sprint followed by:

Three-day competition. Cumulative time from all three days to count.

Day 1 – Middle

Day 2 – Long

Day 3 – Long

Early bird discount To midnight Sun 29th Dec 2019

Standard entry To midnight Sun 15th Mar 2020

Enter On The Day

There will be a limited number of Enter on the Day (EOD) Hard, Moderate, Easy and Very Easy courses available during the Easter Carnival. Participants will be timed, but there will be no prizes. To EOD go to the Registration Tent at each day's arena.

Technical

The Rules

Easter 2020 is being run in accordance with the Orienteering Australia Rules for Foot Orienteering. All participants must comply with the Rules. Of relevance to elite competitors - the IOF Rules for World Ranking events will also apply and will be on the carnival website nearer the event.

Elite Prologue/Family Relay/Public Sprint - Friday 10th April

Three events in one

1. **Elites** - enter the respective gender course – see table below.
2. **Family Relays** - for teams of three from the same immediate family: L,M,S
3. **Individual** - enter in one of the available courses: L,M,S

How will the relay work with Elite Runners?

So that we can run the event as a true relay all elite runners will be first starters (they will not have to run again). Once the race gets under way your team's second leg runner will wait in the tag box with an official who will start you at your elites finish time.

Example: Team Dent - Julian, Phoebe and Jose

If Julian Dent ran 15.25 in the elite prologue- then the next runner either Phoebe or Jose will be started by the official, in the tag box 15.25 after the Family Relay begins.

In the case of a team with two elites then the third leg runner would start at the tag box at the combined time of the two elites.

This way the first third leg runner home will be the outright winner!

The team winning on Handicap will be announced at the presentation

NB: Only one male elite and one female elite can be included in any team.

(If by chance there is a team of 3 elites, then one of them must run the short leg).



How to Enter the Family Relay

The Family Relay will consist of three legs - Long, Medium & Short courses. Competitors may enter a 3-person family team to run the relay.

First step is to enter the Public Sprint via Eventor - this is where you pay for the relay. If there are elites in your team, they do not have to enter this event.

Second step is to enter the Family Relays Event registering your 3 runners against their respective legs: L, M, S. If you have an elite or two in your team include them here.

Timing Devices

All events at Easter 2020 will use SPORTident Air Card ("SIAC") controls.

Old model SPORTident ("SI") cards can still be used.

NB: If you have a SIAC Card, please make sure it is the registered stick in your Eventor Account before you enter.

Limited supplies of SIAC are available for hire via Eventor when you enter. These will be allocated on a first in basis. SI cards will also be available to hire at the Arenas, including for Enter on the Day participants.

Start Times

Participants will be allocated start times for all events during the 3 Day Easter Carnival.

Results

For the carnival we will be transmitting live race results, not only to on-site TV screens, but also to personal portable devices and internet enabled websites - courtesy Living it Live. Results and splits will also be available on Eventor as soon as possible after each event.

Embargoes

All the areas being used for the Easter 2020 Carnival are embargoed – you must not train on or visit these areas:

Prologue/Sprints - Charles Sturt University

Day 1 - The area known locally as Noahs Ark Ridge, to the north of Packham Drive, SW of Molong (private property).

Day 2 - Gumble Pinnacles (private property)

Day 3 - Gumble Pinnacles (private property)

Shadowing

Shadowing (with the exception of the M/W10 Novice class) by parents and/or coaches is not allowed during Easter 2020.

In the M/W10N class, entrants are permitted to receive assistance on the course (shadowing or direct assistance) and shall also be given the opportunity to study their course with a parent or mentor for up to 10 minutes before their start time. Times shall not be recorded for this class. Shadowing parents or coaches must run their own course before shadowing novices.

If newer orienteers do not want to go out alone or if parents are concerned about older children going out alone, we strongly recommend the Enter on the Day options.



Old Maps

Copies of the previously used competition areas maps will be available on the Carnival website.

Course Lengths & Winning Times

Approximate course lengths and winning times will be in accordance with Orienteering Australia Rules for Foot Orienteering.

Actual course details (length, total climb, number of controls and number of refreshment controls) will be available in a subsequent Bulletin and the Guide.

Terrain, Climate & Hazards

Prologue/Sprint – typical University terrain of buildings, gardens, covered areas with surrounding parkland.

Noahs Ark Ridge – ridge with intricate rock detail alongside open gully/spur terrain.

Gumble Pinnacles – complex granite with some open sections of forest.

Climate: Temperatures in the Molong area in April average max of 22°C in the day and 6°C overnight. Rainfall – mean number of days 1mm = 4 days.

Hazards: University sprint – blind corners and kerbs

Bush events – rough terrain and obstacles, heat/cold/exhaustion, wildlife, remote area

Start and Finish Procedures will be in accordance with Rules 22 and 23 of the Orienteering Australia Rules for Foot Orienteering 2018. More details will be in a subsequent bulletin and the Guide.

Awards will be presented to the winners and placegetters of all championship classes. Certificates will be presented to winners and place getters of all other classes.
