Where is the Start?

The start will be located off Mount Leslie Road. Follow the signs into the school grounds and there will be parking available.

When Can I Start?

You can start anytime between 4pm and 6pm. Starting as early as possible gives you more time to complete the course.

When Do I Have To Finish?

You need to finish before the course is closed at 7pm. If you will not be able to complete your course in time you will need to abandon it and head back to the assembly area to arrive by course closure time. Whether or not you have completed your course, you must download your SI at the computer, so that we know you have returned safely and don't organise a search party for you. Also be aware that as soon as the course is closed, the organisers start bringing in controls.

What Are The Courses?

There are 4 courses available for all different abilities.

Long: 3.8km. Moderate to hard navigation.

Medium: 2.5km. Easy to moderate navigation.

Short: 1.3 km. Easy navigation.

Walkers: 2.5km. Easy to moderate navigation.

Do I need an e-stick or P card?

All Tasmanian Orienteering clubs use the SportIdent (SI) electronic punching system so an e-stick or a P card is required at all events. If you do not own an e-stick or P card, you can hire one for \$4 at the event. These are also available for purchase at most events. Please note that P-cards are not suitable for courses with more than 19 controls, so talk to the registration team if you have this problem.
