



Event Information – Albany Town Centre 17-1-2021 **Version 3 (10-1-2021)**

Park to the west of the library in either car park or street park on York Street.

Courses:

- Short 1.0km 8 controls (Easy standard, for beginners & young children)
- Medium 2.8km 24 controls
- Long 4.8km 28 controls (Street orienteering plus the Medium course)

The above courses are measured straight line, so consider adding about 25%.

Please hearken to the following information:

- Toilets and drink fountain available at the start location.
- Print your own descriptions – but they are on all maps too.
- A4 portrait map for Short and Medium 1:4,000
- A4 landscape map for Long Map 1 1:10,000
- Almost all the controls are lockable hanging plastic plate-style controls, some are normal free-standing controls.
- Young kids MUST BE ACCOMPANIED by an elder who is traffic-savvy.

Enter online via Eventor – the only exception are Albany local non-members!

Check in at event registration to confirm you are present and to clear your timing chip. If you do not have a timing chip ADHOC will loan you one at registration.

Pre-start and Start:

You will receive your map at the pre-start which is immediately adjacent the registration table on the south side of the Albany Library. The start triangle is 50m away from the pre-start at the south-east corner of the library building and marked in the terrain by a control stand and flag but with no punch. Minimum 1min start intervals.

Despite being early Sunday morning there will be regular slow-moving vehicular traffic on York Street and the crossing roads. Crossing the upper part of York Street is only permitted via the zebra-striped pedestrian crossing and these are marked with the Crossing Point symbol. On the map York St has solid purple line indicating Do Not Cross – in the spirit of Fair Play for all competitors do not cross the thick purple line. Penalty may be disqualification.

The extreme southern part of York Street has no zebra crossings and no uncrossable purple line – therefore it is permitted to be crossed and has large traffic islands in the middle to assist your passage.
